As we transition out of this pandemic in the future, we will have to do our part to ensure that families that have relied on eviction moratorium are able to maintain their housing or transition into affordable housing. As a renter who has dealt with predatory landlords, it's important to me that tenants — especially tenants who have been struggling to make ends meet — are taken care of. 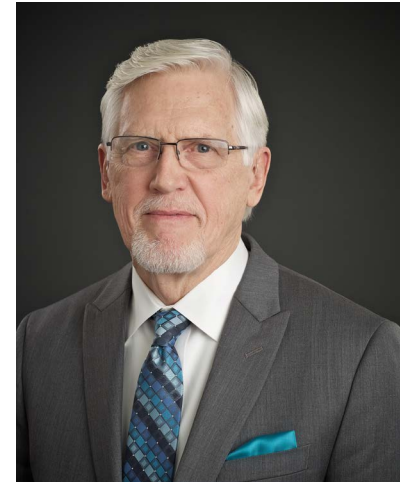
