HB 2051: Increases formula weight for students in poverty families for purposes of State School Fund distributions.

HB 2056: Language Equity

HB 2052: Requires school district to allow students to wear Native American items of cultural significance at public school events, including high school graduation.

HB 2195: Prohibits student from enrolling in virtual public charter school located in school district in which student is not resident if student's resident school district or education service district offers appropriate online instruction.

HB 2368: Establishes pilot program using trauma informed approaches to education, health services, and intervention strategies

HB 2369: Directs ODE to establish statewide mental and behavioral healthcare plan for students.

HB 2406: Expands types of pesticide that may not be included in school list of low-impact pesticides for use in integrated pest management plan.

HB 2408: Directs ODE to conduct study on meeting students' behavioral health needs

HB 2501: Increases formula weight for students in poverty for State School Fund distribution

HB 2504: Establishes disciplinary mediators in school districts

HB 2589: Allows students who have earned a certain score on GED to bypass placement test and developmental education requirements upon entering public institutions of higher ed.

HB 2631: Prescribes notification requirements for school district upon receipt of report of act of harassment, intimidation, bullying or cyberbullying.

HB 2697: Requires education provider to prohibit use or display of any symbols of hate on school property or in education program.

HB 2817: Allows students in GED programs to participate in interscholastic activities

HB 3041: Removes "gender identity" from definition of "sexual orientation" in ORS 174.100 and creates standalone definition of "gender identity" in ORS 174.100.

HB 3130 Provides that certain substitute teachers are considered employees of school district and are eligible for retirement benefits and health benefit plans
