Robin Castro

Statement of Candidacy:

Three days before I wrote this, I was waiting in line at a food pantry asking my community to feed me. Today, I'm humbling asking for your trust to represent the place you call home. My life, like many in my community, has been unnecessarily hard for completely fixable reasons and yet we are still struggling because those with our lived experiences are not being elected to our power. I experienced childhood poverty on top of generational struggle and so my values are deeply rooted in those experiences. Growing up, my mother was a cook and my dad was a janitor; they both worked full time to provide for our family but yet we still



struggled... we still went without electricity at times... and we still needed food assistance. I believe the struggles that my family faced are completely avoidable and thus I am a vocal advocate for anti-poverty measures like Medicare 4 All, Universal Basic Income, Free College, and Free Internet.

We are in the midst of a global health crisis, every Oregonian deserves Medicare 4 All and to offer anything less is unacceptable because those in our community will go without healthcare. We are in the midst of a climate crisis yet we do not have any environmental scientists elected in Oregon to give the depth of background needed for bold climate policy - electing me will change that. We must no longer allow corporate interests to outweigh community health, stability, or safety by enforcing campaign finance reform laws. We must stop expanding freeways and instead expand our public transit system, make them fareless to promote use, and expand light rail throughout the state to connect major cities. I am a vocal advocate for tenant rights, I support expanding the eviction moratorium as it is the reason why I, like many in my community, are still housed. I support a Universal Basic Income as it's the only humane way to address the second financial collapse in a generation. I also believe that we should have Universal Food Stamps. I support expanding worker protections & support unionizing all workplaces. We spent our summer in the streets demanding racial justice and we need a leader who is willing to address anti-Blackness & anti-Asian sentiments in our community. I also believe that accountability for Rep Hernandez actions starts with his resignation - as a sexual assault survivor, I know first hand what accountability looks like.


